Great Bend, Kansas

There is a scripture in Ecclesiastes that became very real to me during my latest outreach at the 3-I Show in Great Bend, Kansas. Ecclesiastes 11: 4 says, "He who observes the wind shall not sow; and he who regards the clouds shall not reap." As most of you reading this know, the winds in Kansas can blow incredibly strong and on our last day of ministering at the 3-I Show it was blowing so strong that we had to put our display inside the tent and close up the flaps. Then I stood outside of the tent in the strong wind and ministered to people as they walked by and drove by in golf carts. (The farm show covered so much area that a lot of people rented golf carts for \$45/day to drive around the farm show.)

I have to admit that the wind was blowing so fiercely on the Kansas Prairie that at first it was hard to get excited about witnessing out there. But, to God be the glory, I did not observe the wind. I sowed and witnessed despite the wind and it turned out to be a great day of evangelism. Many people prayed to receive the Lord including 2 young guys from England and one young man from Australia who were in the Midwest to help with the harvest and to learn more about farming. One of the guys from England asked me if the sinner's prayer was the same as the "Our Father, who art in Heaven" prayer that they pray in England and I had to explain the difference to him. On that same day FFA kids (Future Farmers of America) from Great Bend and Ellinwood and many other people from all over western Kansas prayed to receive Jesus.

If we would have observed the wind then none of these people would have heard the good news of the Gospel and none of them would have gotten saved. This ought to be a lesson to us that no matter how we feel or what the circumstances are if we will just stop, get out of our comfort zone and witness, peoples lives will be touched and changed forever.
